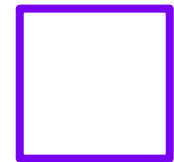




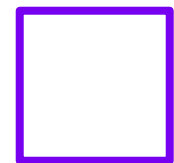

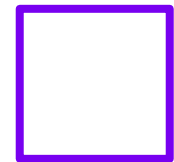
Accessibility checklist for Developers



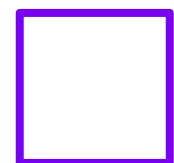
Use semantic HTML to convey the structure and meaning of a page.



Make sure you use link and button elements correctly.



Do not use div or span elements as interactive elements.

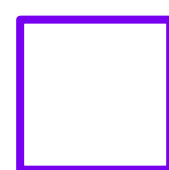


Don't overuse ARIA. Make sure to use ARIA attributes correctly and only when necessary. No ARIA is better than bad ARIA.

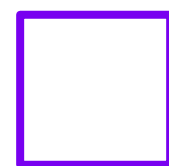




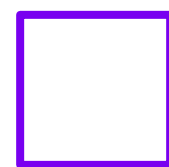

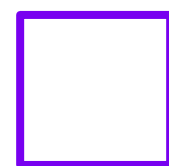
Ensure that the first focusable element on the page is a "skip to main content" link that takes you directly to the page's main content.



Do not limit the size of page elements - allow them to grow as needed.



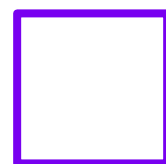
Test all functionality using the keyboard alone.



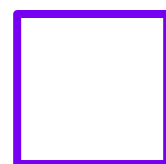
Test all functionality with at least one screen reader, such as VoiceOver, NVDA, JAWS or TalkBack.



Accessibility checklist for Developers



Test all functionality and content by zooming text only up to 200% or zooming all content up to 400% at 1280 pixels wide starting size.



Use preferably the label element for the form field names. Do not misuse the placeholder attribute as a field name.

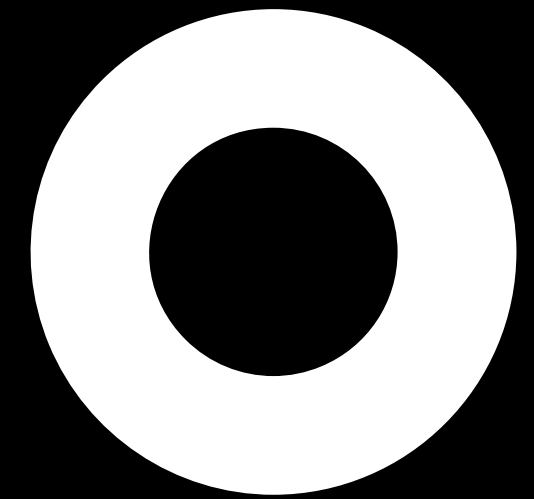

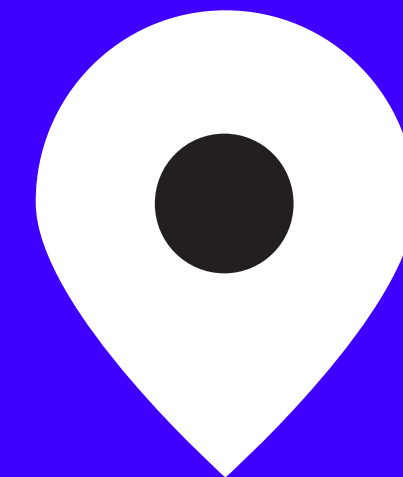
